Establishing the Foundation

- Formed on 10th of October 1989 by Mr. Jagdish Dore (Managing Trustee)
- Objects of the trust (To help directly or through N.G.Os /institutions):
 - Providing financial assistance by way of Scholarships or reimbursement of fees.
 - Providing financial assistance for food/ clothing/ medicines etc. to widows/ orphans/ other needy persons.
 - Provide financial assistance for medical treatment of patients affected by serious ailments like cancer etc.
 - Provide financial support for people affected by natural calamities like floods/ drought/ pandemic.
 - Support objects of the trust irrespective of caste, creed or religion.

Sidvim LifeSciences actively supports the Foundation in activities of the trust by contributions and participation in the activities. Three of the Directors are Trustees of the Foundation.



Snapshot of activities

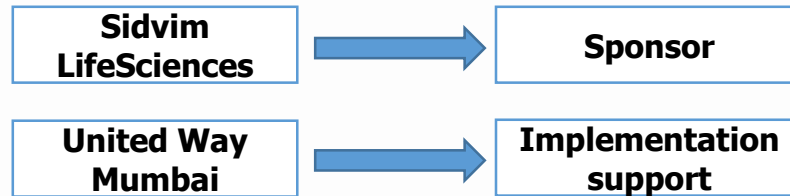
- Sidvim Foundation actively supports Bhuvana Foundation, which runs a school for Tribal Children – “Vidya Vanam” in the outskirts of Coimbatore in Chennai.
- Sidvim Foundation contributed to build an assembly / prayer hall at a school in Udaipur with which it has been associated for many years.
- During the recent pandemic, the Foundation & the employees of Sidvim LifeSciences contributed through an N.G.O – United Ways - to provide provisions & medical aid to migrant labourers affected by the pandemic.
- It is also running a program through the same N.G.O to support children who lost an earning member of their family, by providing financial support for their education. The foundation intends to support them on a continuous basis till they complete their education (*details of this program on next slide*).



Sidvim Scholarship Program

For covid affected families in India

- Sidvim LifeSciences Pvt Ltd in partnership with United Way Mumbai has launched the “Sidvim Scholarship Program”.
- The aim of this scholarship is to alleviate disruptions in education for students that have been affected by the loss of an earning family member or by reduction in family income due to the pandemic.
- **Eligibility:** Candidates are identified via a community mapping exercise targeting marginalized and low-income groups. Eligibility criteria may include financial status, academic and attendance record, referrals from school / college / NGO, student’s own aspiration and course pursued.



In 2021, 40 students studying in Grades 6 and above in Mumbai have been beneficiaries of the Sidvim Scholarship Program.
